BREAKFAST CLUB: Breakfast club from 8:00am to 8:30am. This is a flexible childcare service which parents can drop in on the day at a cost of £3:50 will include choice of cereals, toast, drinks, and activities until the AM session starts.

Fee prices across our childcare service are as follows:

Fee Session price is £16:50 per 3-hour session.

Lunch Club price is £3:50 per lunch club.

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All fees must be paid up to date and in full by the end of each term, a reminder that our policy is not to be more that 2 weeks in arrears. Invoices are sent out

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to parents for the full term`s fees with details how to pay. Parents will receive follow up texts asking for payment if your account is in arrears of 2 weeks.

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Playgroup closed for the February Break from Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February, and we return Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February`25.

Please note our next staff development date is Friday 4<sup>th</sup> April`25. Provision closed for childcare.

Parents please remember:

30 Hour codes and Two-year-old funding for working parents:

Eligible <u>working parents</u> please renew or apply for your 30-hour codes, <u>they must be valid by the end of the month before a new</u> <u>term starts</u> and <u>must</u> be reviewed every 3 months. Eligible <u>working parents</u> can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year old at <u>www.medway.gov.uk/admissions</u> and once again <u>must be</u> renewed every 3 months.

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# HEALTH INFORMATION

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# Health Visitor

Every child under the ago of 5 has a Health Visitor. If parents have any concerns about their child`s health and development, you can call the Health Visitor service who can undertake an age-appropriate developmental check and give advice. They can be contacted via 0300 123 3444.

# Advice from UK Health Agency

We have been asked to help share the information to parents and carers regarding Measles.

## Protect your child from measles.

The number of children catching measles is on the rise. Measles is highly infectious and can make people seriously unwell. One-in-five children who catch measles are hospitalised and in rare cases, it can be fatal.

The NHS are asking parents and carers to check their children are up to date with their MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccinations.

Contact your GP practice to arrange any vaccines that your child may be due, especially before they start school or nursery. This is important, as your child will be mixing with more children. If they are not up to date with their jabs, they could be at risk of catching preventable diseases.

If you are not sure what vaccines your child has had, check their red book or contact your GP practice.

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The early symptoms of measles include: a high fever, sore red, watery eyes, coughing, a runny nose, aching and feeling generally unwell. <u>Find out more about</u> the symptoms of measles on the NHS website.

If you have symptoms of measles stay at home and phone your GP practice or NHS 111. This will help prevent spread of the disease.

## SICKNESS WITHIN PLAYGROUP

Thank you to parents for their continued support in delaying the spread of any infections to the children and practitioners.

If your child is unwell, continuous runny nose or continuous cough, their immune system may be lowered so please do not bring them to playgroup. Children will need rest and good hydration at home until they are well again.

Please do not bring children who have had a temperature during the night and required paracetamol/Calpol or any other medication to lower temperature this will wear off very quickly and the children usually tell us!

Do not bring children who have had diarrhoea and or sickness for a clear 48 hours of the last attack.

Do not bring children that have normal childhood ailments such impetigo, conjunctivitis until they have been treated and please let us know. They are very contagious, and we seem to have had quite a few cases recently within the group.

Please remind your children to wash hands with soap regularly and supervise their hygiene routines more closely at home.

Please telephone, email, text and let us know if your child is not attending playgroup for any reason.

Ensure we have all your up-to-date emergency details, and someone remains contactable while your child is at playgroup.

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If we have no access to the playgroup, if we believe the playgroup site to be unsafe, if we do not have enough staff: children ratio for expected children then playgroup may be closed for childcare. We will endeavour to contact parents on the morning of the closure by text and a message will be placed on the Playgroup website.
